### OUR SHARED INVESTMENT

#### DISTRICTS PAY FOR:

- (2) full-time team members
- Program fees (to NKCES and NKU)
- Varying by district, transportation, tuition, books/course materials, meals

#### NKU PAYS FOR:

- (2) full-time team members
- Annual program operating budget
- Costs of instructional materials not covered by student fees
- Costs of instruction and direct and indirect student support services

#### SCHOLAR REQUIREMENTS

- 3.0 UNWEIGHTED HIGH SCHOOL GPA. SCHOLARS ARE REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN THIS GPA THROUGHOUT THE ADMISSION CYCLE.
- MATH READINESS DEMONSTRATED THROUGH:
  - ACT MATH SCORE OF 19+
  - KYOTE COLLEGE READINESS SCORE OF 23+
  - THERE ARE A LIMITED NUMBER OF **EMERGING SCHOLARS** SPOTS YEARLY FOR SCHOLARS WHO SHOW EXCEPTIONAL PROMISE BUT DO NOT MEET THE MATH PLACEMENT SCORE. THESE SCHOLARS WILL BE DETERMINED BASED ON THEIR APPLICATIONS AND PERFORMANCE ON THE MATH PLACEMENT, EVEN IF THEY DO NOT REACH THE CUTOFF SCORE.
- SCHOOL RECOMMENDATION BASED ON:
  - ATTENDANCE RECORD
  - BEHAVIORAL HISTORY
  - SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL READINESS
  - ACADEMIC ENGAGEMENT
  - OTHER CRITERA AT THE SCHOOL'S DISCRETION
- WE WELCOME ALL TYPES OF LEARNERS, INCLUDING THOSE WHO ARE FIRST-GENERATION COLLEGE STUDENTS, COME FROM A VARIETY OF BACKGROUNDS, OR HAVE DIVERSE LEARNING NEEDS.
- SPECIAL CONSIDERATION IS GIVEN TO SCHOLARS WHO MAY BE UNABLE TO ATTEND COLLEGE WITHOUT THE YSA EXPERIENCE.

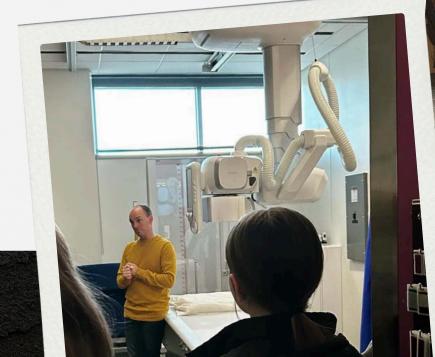

## ADVISING STRATEGIES

- Create advising structures that meet your needs (specialized/cross-trained advisors; college advisor support; schedule reviews; tracking documentation)
- Develop resources to guide meaningful exploration and intentional degree progression (registration guides)
- Design multiple avenues to educate students (YSA for a Day, orientation, UNV 101, learning communities, 1:1 appointments)
- Embed career exploration into conversations, UNV 101, and events
- Educate students on options and opportunities for informed decision-making

## STUDENT ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES

- Emphasize community building and active learning/engagement
- Connect opportunities to student goals, motivations, and needs (speak their language)
- Build intentional time to bring students together regularly with different focuses (social, developmental, advising, networking, etc.), in small and large groups, and with peers who share interests and those who they haven't met before
- Utilize peer ambassadors or leaders to share ideas, plan experiences, support recruitment, etc.



## GENERAL STRATEGIES

- Plan how to engage your local resources
- Create intentional systems and structures for monitoring student performance
  - Multiple adult advocates (advisor + UNV instructor + HS counselor)
  - Weekly team meeting
  - Weekly dashboard updates/outreach
  - Intervention strategies
- Build intentional relationships with point-people
  - o "Our" kids
  - You have to know them





- Respect and celebrate the strengths on both the K-12 and higher education sides of the house
- Intentionally teach the spoken and unspoken expectations of academia
- Build a culture of one
  - One team (not just teams working together)
  - One goal supporting our students
  - One community
- Always remember that these opportunities feel and can be life altering for students even if they are our every day norm. Every moment matters.





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
